Selected Scriptures

In Luke 2:52, we read that Jesus grew in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and men. Wisdom (Greek-"sophia") means learning to fear God. Proverbs 9:10 says that "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." To say that Jesus grew in wisdom is simply another way of saying that He lived in the fear of God.

As God's children, we are commanded to fear the Lord (1 Peter 2:17, Eph. 5:21). God reminds Moses in Deut. 5:29 of His longing for His people to fear Him (cf. Psalm 86:11).

		feel towards a harsh master) and the positive fear, often called the "filial" fear (the loving kind of fear a child would have feel towards his father). The fear of the Lord is a mixture of feelings of reverence and pleasure, joy and awe which fills our hearts when we realize who God is and		
	what He has done for us. In Psalm 130:4 says "But there is forgiveness with You, that You may			
		feared." This means that the fear of the Lord is produced byfor us.
