Jesus, Our Great High Priest

Hebrews 4:14-16

The Book of Hebrews is about the superiority of Jesus Christ. He is superior over angels (Hebrews 1-2), over Moses (Heb. 3), over Joshua (Heb. 4), and even over Aaron and the whole Old Testament levitical priesthood.

A high priest functions as the mediator between the people and God. Once a year (on the Day of Atonement), the high priest alone would go into the Holy of Holies to make atonement for all the sins of the nation. Hebrews 4:14-16 gives us four reasons why Jesus is greater than Aaron or any of the Old Testament high priests.

trials and temptations. We have a mediator who understands our problems. Since He became a man and suffered all that we experience, He sympathizes with our weaknesses. He was tempted in all things like we are and He suffered (Heb. 2:10, 18; Isaiah 53:3). He tasted the greatest and deepest pain – He was made sin for us (2 Cor. 5:21).

3. Because of Christ's _____

Jesus knew how it was to be tempted in every way, yet He did not sin (Heb. 7:26; 1 Pet. 1:19; 2:22). And because of that He understands what we are going through and He is able to come to our aid when we are tempted (2:18).

4. Because of Christ's _____

Heb. 4:16 calls us to draw near with confidence (cf. Heb. 7:25; 10:1; 11:6; 12:18, 22), to approach God's throne with a sincere heart and full assurance of faith. There no need to be afraid of coming before God because His throne is not a throne of judgment but a throne *of grace*, a throne where we find what we desperately need - God's mercy and grace. Mercy is characterized as God's tender compassion and grace is His goodness and love (2 Cor. 5:18). And Christ has made that access possible by His own precious blood (Eph. 3:12).

Since Jesus is our great high priest, the Son of God, who has passed through the heavens, we must hold fast our confession. And, since Jesus is a high priest who sympathizes with our weaknesses, we should draw near to the throne of grace for help in our times of need.
