Why Love One Another?

1 John 4:7-16

Love is what defines all of our relationships. Yet people today are so ignorant of what true love is. Genuine love can only come from God through His Word. Scripture affirms that love is at the heart of God's character and that true love can only be defined in relation to God. John gives us four reasons why we should love one another:

	Love is one of the best attribute or characters of God. True love can only be defined in
	relation to God because "God is love" (1 John 4:8, 16). God's love is a supernatural love.
	It is divine, pure, godly and perfect because it comes out of His perfect character (1 John
	4:10). God's love is infinite (Eph. 3:18-19) immeasurable (Rom. 11:33; Lam. 3:22-23),
	boundless (Rom. 8:35-38; 1 Cor. 13:8) and eternal (Jeremiah 31:3).

	God love is a giving love; and it gives the best. He gave His only begotten Son (1 John 4:9;
	John 3:16; Rom. 5:8) and in giving Jesus, God gave Himself (1 John 4:9-10).

	the weak, the ungodly, His enemies.
