The Power of Christ's Resurrection

John 20:19-31

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the great cornerstone of the Christian faith. Everything that we are, and have, and ever hope to be, all that we believe in is based on the reality of the resurrection (1 Cor.15:12-20). The first sermon ever preached in the church the day the church was born was a sermon on the resurrection (Acts 2:22 ff). The reality of the resurrection became the theme of all apostolic preaching. Paul prayed in Philippians 3:10, "that I may know Him (Christ) and *the power of His resurrection*." The transforming power of Christ's resurrection changed the lives of the early disciples. It still does of people's lives today.

	Because of their fear of the Jewish religious leaders the disciples were confined in one place
	(John 20:19). Though by this time the women had already seen Him and told the disciples
	about it (v. 18); so did two of his disciples who were on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:33-
	35). The Lord appeared to the disciples to remove their doubt and fear (Mark 16:14; Luke
	24:41-43; cf. 2 Tim. 2:7).

	All except Thomas were present when the Lord Jesus appeared. They all believed the risen
	Christ except Thomas (John 20:25). The Lord Jesus rebuked Thomas for his unbelief the nex
	time He showed Himself to them (v. 26). Thomas turned from a doubter to a worshipper.
	Faith which results from seeing is good; but faith which results from hearing is more
	excellent (Matt. 8:5-10; John 4:48 1 Peter 1:8). The resurrection of Christ gave the disciples
	all the assurance and boldness to preach the gospel (Acts 4:31).

	John wrote this gospel to show that Jesus is not only the Son of God but that He is God the
	Son (John 1:1). Christ performed many more unrecorded signs and miracles to prove His
	deity. The resurrection of Jesus did not only prove His deity, it also gives us the assurance of
	eternal life (v. 30,31). Sinners are not saved by believing in miracles; they are saved by
	believing on Jesus Christ (John 1:12; Rom. 10:17).

The resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ has the power to transform lives. As Christians, we have the wonderful privilege of knowing that Jesus our Lord and Savior is truly risen! We see His reality in our lives - how He changed us, how He gave meaning to our lives, how He touched and healed our broken lives. It is also a sobering reality that Christ rose from the dead to confirm His coming judgment. Acts 17:31 says that God, "has appointed a day on which He will judge the world in righteousness by the Man whom He has ordained. He has given assurance of this to all by raising Him from the dead." Only those whose lives are wholly given and surrendered to Jesus will receive God's favorable judgment. Is your life surrendered to Jesus?
