Turning Your Trials Into Triumphs

James 1:2-4

One of the reasons James wrote his epistle is to encourage his persecuted fellow believers as they go through various tests and trials for their faith. James says these trials are not only inevitable but necessary for testing the validity and genuineness of their faith. Trials are normal part of man's life (Job 14:1, 5:7, Psalm 22:11, 31:9, John 16:33, Acts 14:22, 2 Cor 4:8, Phil 1:29; 2 Pet. 2:14; 1 Pet. 4:12).

God calls us to endure and persevere in trials and the benefit that we receive through trials depends (in large degree) upon how we look at them and the spirit with which we respond to them. James gives several essential attitudes in order to persevere or endure trials.

	Paul demonstrates the same attitude in Philippians 4:4 and in Acts 16:25. Our Lord Jesus				
	exemplified it in Hebrews 12:2 and He illustrates it in John 16:20-21.				
	Peter taught it in 1 Peter 2:20. Paul says the same thing in Philippians 1:29 and practiced it in				
	Philippians 2:17.
