How to Glorify God

Psalm 29:1-2, 1 Cor. 10:31

Christians have as their ultimate aim and design, the glory of God. God created us to bring honor and glory to His name (Psalm 29:1-2). Glorifying God is revealing His nature and character to the watching world that they may recognize His glory (1 Chro. 16:24, 27-29). We were created to glorify God (Rom.11:36). It is His purpose (1 Pet. 4:9) and command (Isa. 42:12).

As Christians, our motive, our theme, our goal, our reason, our purpose is wrapped up in this one thing - to give the Lord glory in everything we do. Consider two aspects in this matter of glorifying God:

		7:12). Because He is very protective of His glory (Isa. 42:8), He demands sole worship.

		the heart is set upon God, as a man's heart is set upon his treasure.

		God is glorified when we dedicate ourselves to His service (Heb. 9:14, 1 Thess. 1:9).

	a.	When we Him in everything we do
		God must be the ultimate end of all actions (Exo. 20:1-4; Mark 12:30; Matt. 6:33).
		Putting God first above anything in life shows our utmost reverence for Him (John 8:50).
	b.	When we areSpirit
		Glorifying God means reflecting His character. The more God possess us, the more we
		become like Him. A Spirit-filled life (Eph. 5:18-19) glorifies God (Psalm 50:23).
	<i>c</i> .	When wefor His sake
		In glorifying God, there is the element of sacrifice (Mark 8:34). Glory is associated with
		Christ's suffering (John 12:27-28), in the believer's suffering (Gal. 6:17, 2 Cor. 12:10;
		Phil. 1:29), and even in Peter's death (John 218-19; cf. 1 Peter 4:14).

		God is glorified when we serve Him (Heb. 9:14, John 15:8, Phil. 1:9-11; John 15:8).
	e.	When we
	٠.	God's people are to honor Him with their lives (1 Pet. 2:9,11-12). And their sinful
		lifestyle brings shame to God (Rom. 2:24).
