Whatever happens inside your home concerns God, His gospel and His glory. Your family life is a reflection and expression of Christian discipleship. | | The word submit literally means to put oneself under (Col. 3:18). It talks about the |
| | disposition to yield. Upon marriage, the Christian wife voluntarily takes the position of |
| | helper, instead of leader. The call to submission is not a mark of inferiority. Rather, it is a |
| | glorious and noble call to imitate the Lord Jesus in His subordinate role and joyful |
| | submission to God the Father (1 Cor. 11:3; Matt. 26:39; Heb. 10:5-7; 12:2). The wife's |
| | faithful submission to her husband is her obedience to God's call to be Christlike in her |
| | married life. |

| | The wife's submission to her husband is a heart attitude that is proper, fitting and honoring to |
| | God (Col. 3:18). Such attitude brings supreme praise and utmost glory to God. The phrase |
| | "fitting in the Lord" also indicates that the submission of the wife should be within the |
| | boundaries of what pleases God as revealed in His Word. Such submissive heart depicts the |
| | inward, unfading beauty of a godly woman which is precious in God's sight (1 Pet 3:1-5). |
