What a Comfort

Isaiah 40:1-2

People always try to comfort us in our trouble. They come to us, saying, "Don't worry; everything is all right." Such human comfort has no solid foundation because it does not rest on anything. But God's comfort rests on a solid foundation, which we read about in Isaiah 40.

The first question of The Heidelberg Catechism asks: What is your only comfort in life and death? To which it answers: That I am not my own, but belong body and soul, in life and in death to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ. He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; in fact, all things must work together for my salvation. Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.
