No matter how strong we think we are, life's disruptions can cause our soft hearts to grow faint and weary. In Psalm 61, it is David, the giant killer, the fearless shepherd, the victorious military commander, the courageous king of Israel who is speaks of being overwhelmed and downhearted.

David life was disrupted when his own son Absalom rebelled against him, seeking to dethrone and even to kill him. Fleeing Jerusalem, David went into exile. Like David, Christians are not immune from becoming downhearted. Regardless of our circumstances, God's word clearly teaches us that since God faithfully responds to the call of His people, we must rest our hope in Him. When we face disruptions in our lives, our hope is found in the that fact that we have the listening ear of God, the caring love of God, the powerful deliverance of God, and the sympathetic heart of God.
