## ARMED WITH SALVATION AND SCRIPTURE

(Ephesians 6:17)

No matter how fierce and intense Satan's opposition is, no matter how life threatening our trials are, our salvation in Christ as declared in the Word of God provides us with confidence and assurance that our present struggle with Satan will not last forever. Satan will not have the final victory. Suffering will not have the last word. Even death itself will not be our ultimate destiny. Eternal glory with Christ is our guaranteed future! As we consider the final two pieces of our spiritual armor in Ephesians 6:17, we will learn this central truth: Since we are armed and equipped with the glory of our salvation and the Word of God, we can stand firm against the devil and live in the triumph of Christ.

1. Stand firm against the devil equipped with the \_\_\_\_\_\_

As the soldier's helmet protects his head against the enemy's crushing blows, so the helmet
of salvation spiritually protects our minds against Satan's evil aggression (Ephesians 6:17). The
mind is a major battlefield in our war with Satan (2 Corinthians 4:4; 11:3; 10:5). If Satan could
tamper with our minds and deceive us into doubting the reality and certainty of our salvation, that
will weaken us in our spiritual warfare. That's why we must grasp the truth of our salvation in its
three dimensions. The past dimension of our salvation is called justification whereby God has
delivered us from the penalty of sin and declared us righteous in His sight (Romans 5:9; 4:8-9;
Ephesians 1:7). The present dimension of our salvation is known as sanctification whereby God is
delivering us continually from the power of sin and is conforming us progressively to the image
of Christ (1 Thessalonians 4:3-4; 5:23-24; 2 Corinthians 3:18). The future dimension of our
salvation is termed as glorification whereby God will finally deliver us from the presence of sin
and bring us to eternal glory (Romans 8:23,29-30; 1 Thessalonians 5:8-10). As the wondrous truth
of our salvation in Christ saturates our thinking, we will be strengthened, sustained and victorious
in our spiritual battle.
2. Stand firm against the devil equipped with the
God has armed us with the Word of God as a spiritual weapon which wields the power of
the Holy Spirit Himself in our battle against Satan (Ephesians 6:17; 2 Peter 1:21; 1 Corinthians
2:11-16). If we are to stand firm against the devil, we must apply God's Word in four practical
ways: (a) Use God's Word to fight against sin and temptation (Matthew 4:1-11; 6:31-33; Ephesians
4:31-32); (b) Share God's Word to encourage fellow believers (1 Thessalonians 5:11); (c) Proclaim
God's Word to lead lost people to Christ (Acts 26:18); (d) Sing God's Word in worship (Ephesians
5:18-19; Colossians 3:16; 2 Chronicles 20:21-22).
